HOUSE AND SENATE SUMMERTIME HEARING ON IMMIGRATION

This month marked the beginning of a series of hearings that will be conducted nationwide to further examine the complexities of our failed immigration system and to determine what provisions a new piece of legislation needs to include to remedy the issues. Moreover, the hearings to be held throughout the summer will examine the nation's labor needs and the porous borders that need to be secured. Though some members of congress state that the purpose of the field hearings is to better understand what American's want to be included in an immigration reform bill, as a practical matter, the hearings delay the debate from advancing and postpone conference between the House and Senate; until the hearings are complete, negotiations to reconcile the two bills will not begin. As speculated by many, the hearings will be used as a political platform where Republicans and Democrats will spar over the best approach to be taken; it will likely prove to be a battle over political positioning. GT remains closely involved and has suggested witnesses to testify at the hearings on behalf of our clients. Additionally GT has submitted letters stating our support for comprehensive immigration reform to be made part of the hearing record.
